USFWS: Marbled Murrelet Videos Provide Rare Glimpse of Elusive Seabird

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recently released two videos about the threatened Marbled Murrelet, a diving seabird protected in Oregon, Washington and California under the Endangered Species Act.
